
TO: THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 102 OF HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS, AND TO ALL OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS:

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Directors of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 102 will hold a **regular meeting**, open to the public, at **6:00 p.m.** on **MONDAY, 27 NOVEMBER 2017**, at **15300 Falmouth, Harris County, Texas**, inside the boundaries of the District, to consider and act upon the following matters:

1. Consider comments and questions from District residents (3 minute limit);
2. Minutes of the meeting of 23 October 2017;
3. Security Report (Harris County Sheriff's Department), including discuss renewal of Security Service Contract and authorize actions deemed necessary;
4. Solid Waste Collection Report (contract expires 4/30/19; 60-day notice);
5. Report of the Tax Assessor/Collector, including:
 - (a) approve payments from the District's tax account;
 - (b) review and authorize actions for the collection of delinquent taxes, including possible termination of service;
 - (c) review and approve Assignment and Assumption of Agreement for Services of Tax Assessor/Collector;
 - (d) review and approve Amendment to Agreement for Services of Tax Assessor/Collector;
6. Operator's Report, including:
 - (a) operation of the District's facilities;
 - (b) discuss and authorize any repairs or other work by the Operator deemed necessary;
 - (c) report regarding status of sanitary sewer overflows, permit violations, and/or insurance claims;
 - (d) report regarding water accountability;
 - (e) discuss status of billing to District customers affected by Hurricane Harvey flooding event and authorize actions deemed necessary;
 - (f) authorize actions related to Hurricane Harvey flooding event, including requests for public assistance to FEMA;
 - (g) status of repairs relating to 18 April 2016 flooding event, including status of Request for Public Assistance filed with FEMA;
 - (h) authorize action against delinquent accounts, including termination of service;
 - (i) review packet for new customers of the District;
7. Engineer's Report, including:
 - (a) report regarding maintenance of Concord Colony, Section Two and Waldron Estates detention facilities, including renewal of Storm Water Quality permits;
 - (b) status of TCEQ Sanitary Sewer Overflow Initiative and authorize actions deemed necessary;

- (c) discuss condition of WWTP onsite lift station and authorize actions deemed necessary;
 - (d) requests for service, including Redeemed Christian Church of God – House of David;
 - (e) review inspection report on hydropneumatic tanks (Water Plant No. 1) and authorize actions deemed necessary;
 - (f) request for service: 2.0-acre tract on Addicks Satsuma Road (Seven Star Plus, Inc.);
 - (g) discuss and authorize actions related to damages caused by Hurricane Harvey;
8. Bookkeeper's Report, including:
- (a) authorize payment of the District's bills;
 - (b) review investments in the District's accounts;
 - (c) review Depository Pledge Report;
9. New business, including:
- (a) discussion regarding possible sale of Series 2018 Bonds;
 - (b) adopt Resolution Declaring Intent to Reimburse Project Costs from Bond Proceeds (flood mitigation and sanitary sewer lift station improvements);
10. Old business, including:
- (a) review and possibly approve Agreement for Out-of-District Service to 2-acre tract on Addicks-Satsuma Road (Seven Star Plus, Inc.);
 - (b) status of surface water issues related to West Harris County Regional Water Authority;
 - (c) discuss power supply issues (P3);
 - (d) status of issues related to District's web site, including review of content;
 - (e) discuss landscaping issues, and authorize actions deemed necessary;
11. Attorney's Report, including approval of certified agenda of 26 June 2017 executive session;
12. Executive session pursuant to Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Government Code, if necessary, to discuss matters relating to pending or contemplated litigation, personnel matters, real estate transactions, or security;
