
TO: THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 102 OF HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS, AND TO ALL OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS:

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Directors of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 102 will hold a **regular meeting**, open to the public, at **6:00 p.m.** on **MONDAY, 24 SEPTEMBER 2018**, at **15300 Falmouth, Harris County, Texas**, inside the boundaries of the District, to consider and act upon the following matters:

1. Consider comments and questions from District residents (3 minute limit);
2. Minutes of the meeting of 27 August 2018;
3. Security Report (Harris County Sheriff's Department);
4. Solid Waste Collection Report (contract expires 4/30/19; 60-day notice), including discussion on renewal of contract;
5. Report of the Tax Assessor/Collector, including:
 - (a) approve payments from the District's tax account;
 - (b) review and authorize actions for the collection of delinquent taxes, including possible termination of service;
 - (c) public hearing on Tax Rate;
 - (d) adopt Order Levying Taxes;
 - (e) approval of amendment to the District's Information Form (tax rate and bonds issued) and authorization for filing of same;
6. Operator's Report, including:
 - (a) operation of the District's facilities;
 - (b) discuss and authorize any repairs or other work by the Operator deemed necessary;
 - (c) report regarding status of sanitary sewer overflows, permit violations, and/or insurance claims;
 - (d) report regarding water accountability;
 - (e) status of electrical surge suppression at District facilities;
 - (f) authorize actions related to Hurricane Harvey flooding event, including requests for public assistance to FEMA;
 - (g) status of repairs relating to 18 April 2016 flooding event, including status of Request for Public Assistance filed with FEMA;
 - (h) discuss TCEQ Advanced Review of Compliance History (ARCH);
 - (i) authorize action against delinquent accounts, including termination of service;

 - (a) report regarding maintenance of Concord Colony, Section Two and Waldron Estates detention facilities, including renewal of Storm Water Quality permits;
 - (b) status of contract for 10-year inspection of cleaning and rehabilitation of sanitary sewer system in Area B – Phase II (Magna-Flow Environmental, Inc.);

- (c) status of contract for conversion of WWTP disinfection system (N & S Construction Co., L.P.);
 - (d) status of plans for flood mitigation at sanitary sewer lift stations;
 - (e) status of TCEQ Sanitary Sewer Overflow Initiative and authorize actions deemed necessary;
 - (f) discuss condition of hydropneumatic tanks (Water Plant No. 1) and authorize actions deemed necessary;
